Welcome back to the final term of the year! We hope you all had a lovely Easter break. The children are already working hard to make the most of their remaining learning time in Year 4. We have an exciting range of activities planned for our topic this term and are looking forward to seeing the progress that the children will make. There will be a unit outcome later in the term where the children will be sharing their Tudor portraits and knowledge of the Tudor monarchs.



Main topics and learning this term:

Portraits

Changing Power of the Tudor Monarchs

Skeletons



Our main topic this term is the changing power of the Tudor monarchs. The children will be learning all about how the Tudor monarchs made use of their power whilst on the throne. They will be developing their historical enquiry skills and utilising their research skills to extend their knowledge about the Tudor era of history.

In English we have started to study the book *Varjak Paw* by S.F Said. The children will be studying the text in detail and looking closely at the motivation of the characters, the author's choice of language and the effect on the reader of the author's choices. Through drama, reading activities and trying out some of the author's written techniques the children will develop a clear understanding of how S.F. Said has created such a powerful story for the reader.



Our Science topic this half term is skeletons. We will be learning about the role of the skeleton including how it offers protection and support to the body. The children will learn about movable joints and how muscles contract in order to move bones. There will be lots of practical activities for the children to get involved with to further their understanding.

In Maths we will be reviewing topics that we have already studied this year, deepening our understanding and applying our knowledge to more complicated problem solving. We will be covering fractions, multiplication (please keep practising your times tables), decimals and formal written methods for the four operations.
