The children have made an excellent start to the second half of the Autumn term. Year 4 have really enjoyed the variety of learning opportunities that they have had. Our Anglo Saxon Day was a great success and the learning was rewarding – thank you for all of your efforts to get them equipped for a day outside. The children have learned a great deal and we hope that you will be able to see how much they have enjoyed it when you see their work at parents evening. We will soon be starting to rehearse for the Christmas play and will get costume information to you as soon as possible.



Main topics and learning this term:

Vicious Vikings

Light

We are continuing to learn about the Vikings this term. The children will be learning more about the reliability of different historical sources and will be using this knowledge to help deepen their understanding of events in this era. The children will be learning more about navigation skills of the Vikings.



The children's Science learning will move away from sound and will now focus on light, while the DT and Computing will introduce the idea of circuits and control.

Our current English unit is historical poetry raps. The children are really enjoying exploring this genre and are showing some fantastic performance skills – we certainly have some enthusiastic rap stars in the making! Once we have completed this work we will be moving on to write explanations and non-chronological reports, again linked to our Vikings topic.



We are continuing to focus on the four operations this term through a range of different contexts. Year 4 are having big push on times tables learning this half term so please help your child with learning them as much as possible at home. This learning is crucial in maths and will greatly help them, particularly when we revisit fractions work .

Our learning continues to link to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. The children are able to talk about these rights in respect of their learning. This term's focus is Article 12: You have the right to give your opinion and for it to be taken seriously.



How you can support your child's learning at home:

- Reading remains fundamental to your child's further learning, so please listen to your child on a regular basis regardless of their ability. If your child has Bug Club, please help them use it.
- Constant revision of multiplication and division facts will always be useful; Mymaths and Woodlands Maths Zone are useful sites.
- Please record any activities that your child undertakes in their Home-link Book and ensure these are in school each day.

Homework: reading, spelling and times table practice

Due to changes in our time tables, **spellings and times tables will be tested on Fridays.**

We will be sending home maths homework on alternate Fridays, for the other weeks we set a long-term homework project to complete. We are asking them to create a Viking scene in a shoe box. For example they might choose to create a 3D coastal scene with a long-ship arriving for battle or a furnished Viking hut. We look forward to seeing their creations!
